The Eisenhower Series College Program is a United States Army War College outreach program that exposes intellectually curious university and civic audiences who have little direct knowledge of the military to men and women with significant "on-the-ground" experience with national security. Provided at no cost to hosting institutions, we seek to improve <u>mutual</u> "civil-military" understanding of national security issues by briefly sharing the candid insights of our US Army War College fellows regarding current national security issues, and by listening attentively and responding to the questions and perspectives of our audiences. Each year various teams of three to five of our fellows visit select universities and their communities nationwide.

Meaningful dialog with national security professionals, not official talking points

Our graduate fellows draw upon 17+ years of national security experience, academic research, and personal reflection to develop short talks that link the strategy, theory, or policy of national security to on-the-ground execution. During informal classroom discussions, moderated panels, or Q&A sessions after brief formal remarks, our fellows engage in constructive, candid conversations that may support or challenge current policies, and their unique practitioners' perspective deepen audiences' understanding of current security and military issues.





Each fellow also brings specialized knowledge and regional experience from Europe, Asia, the Middle East, the Americas, and/or Africa to the discussions. Past topics have covered national public policy issues such as: defense transformation, counterinsurgency, competition with China and Russia, stability operations, peace-keeping, future threats, information warfare, international drug trafficking, nuclear non-proliferation, civil-military relations, and numerous other issues associated with national security. Panel members are also prepared to discuss current social issues and their impact on both national security and America's Armed Forces.

Engaging classrooms, university speaker series, and civic organizations

The Eisenhower Series College Program is generally available from January through May, and incurs no cost to the host organizations. Our travel schedule is developed in response to invitations from colleges, universities, businesses, and civic organizations and usually include multiple engagements on a given campus or within a given metro area. The locations of events are subject to change each year based on the invitations received and our desire to engage diverse public audiences.
